2023 in Review

It's hard to believe that another year is winding down here on our beautiful island. Once again, the year has been busy with lots of accomplishments and lots of fun! I want to take this chance to share many of the 2023 accomplishments of the SSCA and all our amazing volunteers. I also want to give a big "Thank You" to those Board members who will be ending their SSCA term in January: Rick Koch, Mike Guarracino, Lisa Minerich, Penny Lobred and Ernie Dash. All these Board members have contributed so much to the SSCA and to our community. (Penny Lobred's term will also end this year, but she has agreed to run for a second term – and for that, we are very grateful!) We have a great slate of candidates running to fill the empty positions: Aida Alvarez, Sue Bigbee, Steve Hotchkiss, Penny Lobred (running for a second term), and *Susan Ippolito*. The candidates Bios and Pictures are included in this Newsletter. A ballot for the election will be sent out separately to your primary SSCA email before year-end. Please cast your vote for this slate of officers.

First, I want to begin at the end – specifically our year-end Financials. I am happy to report that we will end the year in a strong financial position, once again exceeding our revenue budget and coming in under our expense budget. This allowed us to complete a few extra projects we did not anticipate being able to do this year, and to add more to our reserves for future maintenance costs.

Other 2023 accomplishments include:

- Installed new Pickleball Courts at Sea Oats Park.
- Installed 6 new boat slips at Loblolly Marina, 2 additional dry slips and a transient slip at the North Marina and kayak racks at Soundview Park. In addition, we are working with Eagle Scout *Michael Eaton* to add 6 dry slips at the North Marina.

- Worked with the Town and Martins Point to submit a request for a CAMA permit to move the Ginguite channel navigational markers
- Implemented electronic invoicing for marina slips (and electronic signature of the Marina Rental Agreement!)
- Implemented the capability for multiple email addresses for members
- Rebuilt the Chicahauk crossover to allow for accessible ramps to the beach, using Grant Funds from the Outer Banks Tourism Board; plus, the addition of two bypasses to the crossover's west ramp thanks to a contribution from the Chicahuak Homeowners Association.
- Improving and Maintaining Properties included replacing 2 crossovers; repairing docks and finger piers
 at our marinas; regrading 28' of the Hillcrest Access sidewalk and eliminated the standing water problem
 at the beginning of the walkway to the beach by installing a drain line and new walkway section to redirect water; and replacing the basketball hoop at Sea Oats Park.
- Repaved the North Marina Ramp and repaved the lower drive.
- Repaired and repainted the Hillcrest Tennis Court Gazebo, completed by volunteers from the Tennis Club (now known as Raquet Club)

- Clean Up Parks and Crossovers Several clean-up parties were held this year, including the week-long Earth Day clean-up of our crossovers, parks, marinas, trails, and paths in April (coordinating with the Town of Southern Shores and Chicahauk Home Owners Association) and the North Marina and Pavilion Clean-up in October.
- The Hospitality Welcome Committee delivered more than 35 welcome baskets to new full-time residents. The committee also obtained new baskets and donations from local businesses to fill those baskets.
- Installed our first Audit Committee comprised of a highly competent and experienced group of volunteers who completed the 2022 SSCA audit in 6 weeks. This group filled a desperate need to perform this task, as there were no audit firms willing to take on this work for the SSCA. Thank you to *Susan Ippolito, Katie Frampton, Teddy White and Noel Langlois* for taking on this effort! A copy of the final audit report is available at the SSCA office if anyone is interested in reviewing it.
- Sponsored Various Community Events From Yoga, meditation and balance classes, three Music in the Park events, and a Volunteer Appreciation Event, these events brought our community together for some fun and camaraderie! And, ending the year once again with the Santa Ride, which included the Southern Shores Volunteer Fire Department, the Town of Southern Shores, and the Southern Shores Police Department, and Martins Point.
- Hosted our first Spring Into Action Open House to share with the community the various opportunities for volunteering in our community.
- Updated the SSCA Bylaws to allow for 3-year director terms, with 3 directors replaced each year; capability to use an independent Audit Committee to prepare annual SSCA audits; the use of electronic voting for all SSCA voting required by membership; and, clarification of existing practices.
- Installed a new "Welcome to Southern Shores, A Community of Volunteers" sign at Triangle Park (thank you to the Town for doing this!), along with landscaping that improves this highly visible location in our community, thanks to the work from the Dunes of Dare Garden Club volunteers!
- Hired a new Office Assistant, *Debbie Beach*, who quickly jumped in during our busiest time and kept us afloat with processing membership applications!
- Boat Club Events Four events were held this year, including the Fourth of July Picnic, a Crab Feast, an Oyster Roast, and the December Ugly Sweater Holiday Party.

Ongoing Volunteer Work – Our volunteers put in thousands of hours of volunteer work to help our community. This includes sea grass planting (over 100,000 sprigs of sea grass planted in late 2022 and early 2023), the monitoring of the crossover/marina parking lots (so that our members have places to park at the beach during our busy summer); the refilling of our Free Little Libraries and the Doggie Waste Bag Stations; pulling in/ out trash cans at our parks, marinas and crossovers; and sweeping sand and picking up trash at the crossovers throughout the year. Also, a special shout out to two volunteers who have helped us all year long in the SSCA Office: *Maslin Seal and Kathy Patt*! Without these ladies, we would have struggled with processing all the membership applications and packages in January and February!

Pickleball Courts Update!

YES! The courts are ALMOST ready for play! Our hope is that the courts will be opened for play by January 1. If you've driven by in the last week or so, the courts look finished -- fencing is up and the nets are installed. HOWEVER, we need to ensure safety at the courts before we can allow use. A town inspection needs to be completed, the locks (with code access) still need to be installed, and the walkway to the courts from the parking lot needs to be installed. While a complete walkway will not be completed before early spring, we are hoping to put something in place at the gates that will minimize tracking dirt and gravel onto our new courts. It will be important that players clean their shoes before going on the courts. In addition, landscaping around the courts will be done in early Spring.

The online court reservation system is ready to implement. Those wishing to sign up to play must use the online reservation system. Information on how to sign up will be sent to Racquet Club members. Effective January 1, you must have joined the SSCA and Racquet Club for 2024 to use the courts.

Pickle Ball players should follow posted guidelines, including the hours of operation and reservation requirements. In addition, NO PARKING signs on Sea Oats and Hillcrest will be posted by the town. Please respect our neighbors and do not park along the road.

A Pickleball Court GRAND OPENING is being planned for early January! Hope to see all our pickle ballers out there! Stay tuned for the day and time of event!

And, finally, THANK YOU to all those volunteers that helped make our pickleball courts a reality! The Ad Hoc Pickleball Committee, chaired by *Rick Koch and included Carol Noonan, Jim Connors, Trixie White and Dixie Weier* guided the project from the beginning. (Thank you, Jim, for providing the required drawings for permits at a substantial discount!) Also, thank you to the Tennis Club for welcoming the pickleball players to their club, and agreeing to changing the name of the club to Racquet Club. This amenity is a highly desired addition to our community that will provide recreation to our residents and guests for a long time.

Active participation by volunteers helped in the following 2023 accomplishments:

- Crossover monitoring-25 volunteers, monitor crossovers for cleanliness and safety
- Earth day clean up week-72 volunteers, clean up of parks, marina, pavilion, beach, crossovers, trails and tennis court areas, weeding and mulching, etc
- Sea grass planting-100 volunteers, planted over 1 mile and 100,000 spriggs
- Parking monitor volunteers-20 volunteers, provide monitoring of lots and education about SSCA parking regulations, and wrote citations as needed
- Recycle and Trash cart roll outs and ins-5 volunteers at specific locations
- Welcome Basket Team-10 volunteers, delivery of 35 plus baskets, requesting and gathering of donations, creating baskets and updating system
- Little Free Library stewards-4, new doors built, painting of two, and manage books
- Properties work crew-14 volunteers, crossover management, decon, recon, etc
- Beach volleyball set up and tear down at Hillcrest- 4 volunteers, spring and fall
- Dog station management-2 volunteers for many stations
- Fitness programs- 4 volunteer certified instructors, balance, yoga and meditation classes provided throughout the year at Pitts Center
- Triangle Garden/Dunes of Dare Garden Club -10 volunteers, design and planting of garden, maintenance of garden
- Music In the Park-6 volunteers, 3 concerts at Soundview Park, bocce, smores
- Santa Ride with SSVFD, SSPD, CPOA, TOSS and Martins Point

Jim is who I call our "Harbor Master" at the North Marina and Pavilion. While we have our monitors who sign up for weekly monitoring of our parking lots, Jim takes on the job at the North Marina all year round. We are very lucky that Jim lives right there – the marina is almost part of his yard. He keeps a sharp eye on anything that seems out of order, and will let us know if anything
