President's Message (continued)

Marina Volunteer Team – In early May we solicited help for a new Marina Volunteer Team, which could help us with the ongoing maintenance needs at our marinas. This team will be used to help with small projects (too small to hire contractors) but are important to our marinas' upkeep. Thank you to **Tony and Sue Bigbee, Wes Brubaker, Luke Falconer, Mike Greene, Joe Harverson, George Haber, Eric Howard, Matt Howdershell, Rick Koch, Bill Lanier, Laura Lilieberg, John Muuse, Ted Persons, Len Schmitz, Robert Trumbull, Cory Waters, and Harold Weissler**. And a special thank you to their fearless leader, **George Kirby!**

This new **Marina Volunteer Team** immediately stepped in and took care of many small projects (new fire-hose bumpers, replacing boards and bulkhead caps), but also took on a bigger project with reconstructing a shed that was scheduled to be demolished (because the contractor cost to rebuild was just not worth it). Members of this new Marina Team showed up Memorial Day weekend and replaced the rafters, roof and flooring. We now have another beautiful shed to store supplies and oyster tables for the Boat Club.



SSCA Annual Clean-up Event – During April, the SSCA coordinated efforts with CPOA and TOSS to clean up our parks, marinas and crossovers. This annual event brings out many members each year to help with the clean-up efforts. To help with this effort, Site Coordinators were assigned locations to sign-in volunteers and handout supplies. Thank you to **Charlie Andrews, Jay Dunlap, Carolyn Hoover, Tanya Manzhukh, Maslin Seal, and Chris Toolan** for your help with coordinating. And thank you to the over 80 volunteers who came out for the three day event and helped to collect over 150 bags (almost 4,000 lbs of debris and organic materials)! Annual Southern Shores Clean-up Event

Each year, we look forward to gathering to honor Earth Day and support environmental protection. We are a community that is united by a love of the ocean and volunteerism, and the unique opportunities that life offers on a barrier island.

This year, we surpassed the number of volunteers and volunteer hours from last year and also, succeeded in collecting over 150 bags of debris and organic material, or almost 4,000 lbs. We could not have done this without the help of volunteers. We are also very grateful to ***Amy's Candles, Dare County Extension Master Gardeners, Home Depot, OBX Tree Doc, Steamers, The OBX Way, The Surfrider Foundation, and VusicOBX***, for their support. Four lucky volunteers won tickets to a VusicOBX show, dinner for two at Steamers, and candles from Amy's Candles.

Our goal was not only to clean up the community but, more importantly, to raise awareness of the 2024 global Earth Day campaign, "Planet vs. Plastics." According to EARTHDAY.org, plastic production has now grown to more than 380 million tons per year. More than 500 billion plastic bags—one million bags per minute—were produced worldwide last year. Many plastic bags have a working life of a few minutes, followed by an afterlife of centuries. Even after plastics disintegrate, they remain as microplastics, minute particles permeating every niche of life on the planet. And 100 billion plastic beverage containers were sold last year in the United States. That's more than 300 bottles per inhabitant.

How to Access YourCourts

We continue to get questions on how to reserve time at SSCA Racquet Club facilities and how to access YourCourts. For Tennis, all play is by reservation using the sign-up sheets located inside the courts at Hillcrest Courts. If you have forgotten the code, please contact the SSCA office.

For pickleball, you will need to use the YourCourts app to reserve time. All pickleball time is by reservation only. If you are a new user, follow the steps below:

Open Play Opportunities at Tennis and Pickleball Courts

A reminder to everyone about open play opportunities at our SSCA tennis courts at Hillcrest and pickleball courts at Sea Oats Park.

Tennis: Three open play times reserved each week (all times are Summer hours).

- 1. Wednesday Mixed Doubles** - meets at 5 pm. Format is short 4-game sets with no ad. Play is casual, but all levels are welcome. Please email tennis@sscaobx.org for more information.
- 2. Friday Women's Play** - meets at 8 am. Please email tennis@sscaobx.org to get your name added to the mailing list.
- 3. Saturday Men's Play**- meets at 8 am. Format is flexible depending on how many players. No reservations are needed. Just bring your game.

Pickleball: Open play Monday through Thursday from 8 am to noon. Login into YourCourts as described above. The Reservation Screen will appear with a Schedule for the current day. You may join a Pickleball Open Play session or reserve a court for Casual Play. You can scroll to other days and can reserve up to 4 sessions per week and up to two weeks in advance. The Reservation Instruction window to the right includes information you may need, such as rules of play and the gate code. Guest members are limited to 3 sessions per week.

Pickleball Open play may be reserved up to 4 times per week and is limited to the first 16 sign ups. If a session is full, add your name to the waiting list and you will be notified if there is a cancelation.

Newbie Pickleball Clinic

If you are new to pickleball or feel you need a refresher, we have a FREE Newbie Clinic every Friday at 1pm. Please use the YourCourts app to reserve a slot. It is suggested to reserve with a friend to ensure there will be enough participants. Please email tennis@sscaobx.org for more information.

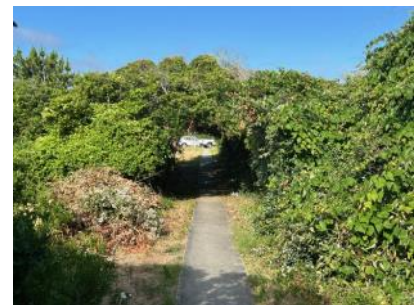

All SSCA properties are private property owned by SSCA members. These properties include the North, South and Loblolly marinas, the North Marina pavilion, the 34 beach crossovers, Hillcrest Tennis Courts, Seat Oats Pickle Ball Courts, Sea Oats and Soundview Parks, and the Sunset and Kingfisher Overlooks. Your membership in the SSCA is critical to the maintenance and repair of the parks, parking areas, marinas, beach accesses, and other common properties that serve your community. It also shows your support for those who volunteer with the SSCA to keep it running - from the board members to the beach clean-up organizers, parking monitors and to those crucial volunteers who pound the nails to keep our community properties repaired. We are truly a community of volunteers! Membership dues help to support the maintenance and improvements of all these amenities. Membership is totally voluntary, but it is so vital to our community! So, if you have neighbors and friends who are residents (fulltime or parttime) of our community, but don't belong to the SSCA, please encourage them to join, we need their support!

Through June 15th, about 91% of our SSCA memberships have renewed. The introduction of electronic payment of SSCA invoices was instrumental in achieving this high rate of renewal. If you have not renewed your membership yet and want to continue to support the SSCA, please renew as soon as you can (this can be done online at sscaobx.org). The dues for full-time residents, second homeowners, and non-seasonal long-term renters are only \$70. The dues for seasonal rentals (including those with rentals through Vacasa, VRBO, AirBnb, etc., as well as traditional local rental companies) are \$100. Racquet Club and Boat Club memberships are separate. A Boat Club membership is \$30 each and a Racquet Club membership is \$25 each.

Marina Slip Rentals

The wait list for wet, dry and kayak slips continue to grow! In 2023 we added 6 new wet slips at the Loblolly Marina, 2 new wet slips and 1 transient wet slip at the North Marina. This past fall, we completed construction of a walkway and added water and electric to service the 6 new slips at Loblolly. In May, we completed construction of two additional kayak racks located at Loblolly Marina. This reduced our waitlist for kayak slips from 16 to a modest 4. A big "SHOUT OUT" to **Bob Baculik**, the SSCA volunteer who built both racks for us! The SSCA provided the materials and **Bob** generously supplied the labor and construction know how. While these slips didn't get rid of our wait list, it did give us a few more slips to offer our members. Unfortunately, there is no additional space at our current marinas for more slips.

A big "THANK YOU" to the fellow boat club members that called the SSCA when they noticed moored boats in the North marina that were in danger of sinking. We had two instances this spring, both after large storms, where a member's boat was taking on water. These concerned SSCA members called the SSCA and reported the situation. We were able to reach out to the boat owners who immediately went to the marina and repaired their boats! What great SSCA members and boat neighbors!

Marina Parking

A reminder about parking challenges and etiquette at the North marinas,

To ensure only SSCA Boat Club members are using our facilities, we will be monitoring the marina lots. **Make sure an SSCA decal is visible on your vehicle and a trailer decal is attached to your boat trailer, so monitors know you're an SSCA Boat Club member authorized to use the marina.** The SSCA will be enforcing the towing policy, and those without decals will be towed at the owner's expense. Also, no trailers are allowed to be parked overnight – with or without decals!

Please consider the following when bringing your boat to the marina for launching:

- Limited parking is available at the North Marina in the upper lot, and along the grassy area along the driveways. Be sure that your trailer does not impede access to the driveways or the boat ramp.
- Park your trailers and trucks responsibly and properly in available spaces. This will prevent a truck or trailer taking up more than one parking space.
- Limited parking is available at the South Marina located off South Dogwood Trail.

Parking FAQs

1. Question: What is the purpose of the boat trailer decal?

Answer: To assist SSCA Parking Monitors to identify SSCA and Boat Club members' vehicles and trailers parking at the marinas. Vehicles/trailers without decals may be towed if found using SSCA parking facilities.

2. Question: How long can a detached trailer park at a Marina with or without a boat trailer decal?

Answer: Trailers with decals may park during the day in UNMARKED spaces only. Marked spaces are rented and paid for by SSCA boat club members, you may not park in these spaces. Trailers without decals are subject to towing. There is NO overnight parking at the marina except for members in legally rented dry slips.

3. Question: Is there a recommended location for placement of the decal?

Answer: The best location for the volunteers to check is on the winch post

4. Question: What is citable related to the boat trailer decal?

Answer: Left overnight, not in a dry slip

Parking FAQs

5. Question: Can a vehicle, with a trailer attached, park in our Marina parking lots with a SSCA decal with a Boat Club symbol but not a boat trailer decal?

Answer: Yes, it's the orphan trailers we need to monitor. This is the 1st year for the trailer decals so we're trying to encourage our members to put the decal on.

6. Question: There are now posts with numbers on them in the North and Loblolly Marina parking lots. Who is allowed to park in those spaces and what decals/passes are valid there?

Answer: All numbered dry slips/parking spaces are rented and paid for by SSCA Boat Club Members. Since they "own" the parking space/dry slip they are allowed to use the slip 24 hours per day seven days per week. They are required to display the required SSCA member decal and trailer decal.

7. Question: Can a vehicle, without a trailer attached, park in the North Marina parking lot with a SSCA decal that does not have a Boat Club symbol?

Answer: Yes

8. Question: Can the North and Loblolly Marinas be used to launch kayaks or canoes by people without the Boat Club decal, even if they are dropped off and are not parking in the SSCA parking lot?

Answer: As clearly identified on the signs at each marina location, the marinas are private property to be used ONLY by SSCA and Boat Club Members and their guests. We will cite a parked vehicle with no, or an inappropriate pass even if they drop the kayaks off, as they are still using the ramp.

9. Question: What if I have not been able to check in to my rental and still want to use the North Marina?

Answer: If you do not have the guest pass or decals indicating membership in the SSCA Boat Club, you will get a warning citation. People get 2 warning citations before they go on the towing list. Therefore, if you can't get into your rental right away and show up at the Marinas without the passes, you will get citation #1. Once you can check in that day and get your passes and property put them in the vehicles you will not get a 2nd citation.
