Still to be completed is new landscaping along the east side of the courts, and some additional seating by courts. If you're not a Racquet Club member, and you want to learn a new fun activity, and meet other pickle ball enthusiasts, you can still join! New docking (and water/electric hook-up) at Loblolly along where new slips were installed last year will a also be completed soon (hopefully by the time you receive this Newsletter).

Our "Super Volunteer", **Joel Newton**, has been working on many projects at our crossovers, getting them ready for the beach season. And, our new West Side Parks and Marina Director, **George Kirby**, has been taking care of repairs at our marinas and parks. Our new Volunteer Coordinator, **Aida Alvarez has** some fun events planned for this year – including 6 musical events that will be held at the North Marina throughout the summer. **Aida** has reached out to musicians that will come share their talents with our community.

In past years, the SSCA held a General Membership Meeting in April. In 2023, a bylaw change allowed us to reduce the number of General Membership meetings to two. But first, the SSBC Boat Club and all the members of the club want to express heartfelt thanks to *George Berry*, the outgoing Commodore, for his outstanding efforts and leadership over the last several years. His management and attention to detail were instrumental to the success of the SSBC. Hats off to *George*!

Membership Sue Bigbee

All SSCA properties are private property owned by SSCA members. These properties include the North, South and Loblolly marinas, the North Marina pavilion, the 34 beach crossovers, Hillcrest Tennis Courts, Seat Oats Pickle Ball Courts, Sea Oats and Soundview Parks, and the Sunset and Kingfisher Overlooks. Your membership in the SSCA is critical to the maintenance and repair of the parks, parking areas, marinas, beach accesses, and other common properties that serve your community. It also shows your support for those who volunteer with the SSCA to keep it running - from the board members to the teachers of the exercise and star-gazing classes, the beach clean-up organizers, parking monitors and to those crucial volunteers who pound the nails to keep our community properties repaired. We are truly a community of volunteers! Membership dues help to support the maintenance and improvements of all these amenities. Membership is totally voluntary, but it is so vital to our community!

Through March 17, about 86% of our SSCA memberships have renewed. The introduction of electronic payment of SSCA invoices was instrumental in achieving this high rate of renewal. If you have not renewed your membership yet and want to continue to support the SSCA, please renew as soon as you can (this can be done online at sscaobx.org). The dues for full-time residents, second homeowners, and non-seasonal long-term renters are only \$70. The dues for seasonal rentals (including those with rentals through Vacasa, VRBO, AirBnb, etc., as well as traditional local rental companies) are \$100. Racquet Club and Boat Club memberships are separate. A Boat Club membership is \$30 each and a Racquet Club membership is \$25 each.

If you do not renew your membership soon, you will stop receiving newsletters and notices of other SSCA events! You don't want to miss out!

Slip Rentals

The wait list for wet, dry and kayak slips shows us that demand for slips is high! To try to meet that demand, your SSCA added two additional kayak racks in late 2022 - four at the Loblolly Marina and four at Soundview Park, and they have all been rented. We are looking at adding more kayak racks at Loblolly Marina in 2024. In 2022, we submitted two Major CAMA Permit applications to the North Carolina Division of Costal Management, in anticipation of adding additional wet slips at the Loblolly and North Marinas. In 2023 we added six new wet slips at the Loblolly Marina, two new wet slips and one transient wet slip at the North Marina. We are currently in the process of constructing a walkway and adding water and electric to service the six new slips at Loblolly. This will be completed this Spring. While these slips didn't get rid of our wait list, it did give us a few more slips to offer our members. Unfortunately, there is no additional space at our current marinas for more slips.

While we know that some people rent slips, but do not always keep a boat in their slip for the entire season, the SSCA does not require a member, who has paid their slip rental fees, to always keep a boat in the slip. Members who have paid can use the slips when and as they wish.







- Repairs were made to Sunset bulkhead after being damaged by a dead Cypress tree which acted
 as a battering ram propelled by Sound waves during a late January storm.
- Plan developed to constructing a 4' wide x 167' long deck along the bulkhead for the six new wet slips at Loblolly Marina. A contractor was hired to construct the deck as well as install electrical and water lines to the power pedestals. The new slips will be fully completed by boating season! All these slips have been rented.
- Working with a contractor, replaced 64' of handrails for the 48A Ocean Boulevard crossover, plus the joists and deck boards through the dune at Hillcrest crossover.
- Contractor replaced Hillcrest shower sunshade boards, deck boards on the ramp from Hillcrest gazebo to the viewing deck.
- Replaced west stairs for the East Dogwood crossover.

Still to be done before the season begins is preparing for the replacement of the 10th Avenue crossover, the west side of the 132A Ocean Boulevard crossover and potentially the Mockingbird crossover due to it being entirely buried in the dune.

Shoveling Sand off of Crossovers

If you wish to shovel sand off of dune crossovers, especially from oceanside stairs, please throw the sand as far as possible to the SOUTH side. If you throw sand to the north (predominant wind direction) side, sand will be blown back in to the area you excavated faster and deeper. This may create a need to replace these stairs prematurely. Thanks for your help!

Racquet Club Jay Dunlap

Except for a few adjustments, pickle ball opened at Sea Oats Park and we celebrated the event with an open house on a warm Saturday morning in January. Courts are open for play daily and, starting April 1, will be open from 8 to 8 – reservations are required.

The Club held their Winter Social at Pine Island in February. The event was well attended by pickleball and tennis players and all had a great time mixing it up.

Spring is here and we are enjoying warmer weather (mostly) and more daylight time in the evening. This is the best time of year to play tennis or pickleball. Planning is in the work for our Spring Social at Hillcrest Courts on May 4. Pickleball and tennis activities are planned. Look for details to be circulated shortly.

In the meantime, everyone is reminded about open play opportunities at our SSCA tennis courts at Hillcrest and pickleball courts at Sea Oats Park.

- 3. **Saturday Mens** meets at 8:30 am. Format is flexible depending on how many players we have. No reservations are needed. Just bring your game.

Pickleball

Open play: Monday through Thursday, 8 AM to 12 PM. All SSCA Racquet Club members can sign up for open play. If you are a new user, follow the steps below to register to play online:

- 1. Enter this website address in your browser window OR click this link: https://www.yourcourts.com/yourcourts/security/showLogin/836280
- 2. Enter your SSCA primary or secondary email address and the temporary password sscalogin
- 3. Click the blue "Log In" bar
- 4. You will be prompted to create a new secure password for your YourCourts account. Password does not have to match SSCA password. If you are an existing user, just login.

The Reservation Screen will appear with a Schedule for the current day. You may join a Pickleball Open Play session or reserve a court for Casual Play. You can scroll to other days and can reserve time up to two weeks in

advance. The Reservation Instruction window to the right includes information you need, inlcuding rules of play and the gate code.

Treasurer's Report Susan Ippolito

The SSCA Civic Association major income categories include owner and rental memberships, marina rentals, and boat and racquet club memberships. We are happy to report that we are \$44,340 ahead in these categories from where we were at this point last year. We have commitments for all our marina rentals and are confident that our membership goals will be met or exceeded this year. It is exciting to see the membership in the racquet club grow after adding our beautiful new pickle ball courts!

Spending continues in accordance with our 2024 budget. We have set targets for our reserve account balances and work towards adding to the balances each year, to eventually meet the balance targets. Reserve account balances are a vital part of the health of our civic association. These accounts are used for major projects, such as building the pickleball courts, but most importantly are held in reserve in case of minor to catastrophic storm damage when we would need these funds to be able to repair and rebuild the SSCA's extensive amenities.

We have formed our internal audit committee for the 2023 audit and the committee members are already hard at work. We expect to complete the audit sometime in the second quarter of 2024. A big thank you to our committee members, three of whom are returning for a second year, *Noel Langlois, Katie Frampton, and Teddy White and a new addition to the team, Pam Lamb.*
