MINUTES OF SSCA REGULAR BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING APRIL 10, 2024

President, Tisa Head, called the meeting to order at 9:00 A.M. at the Pitts Center. Directors in attendance in addition to the President: Joel Newton (Properties), Susan Ippolito (Treasurer/Finance), Aida Alvarez, via Zoom (Volunteer/Social Coordinator), Don Pratt (Long-Range Planning/Bylaws), George Kirby (West-Side Parks and Marinas), Sue Bigbee (Membership/Slip Rentals), Jeff Johnson, via Zoom (Secretary). Penny Lobred excused absence. Quorum confirmed.

Sue moved to approve the 4/10/24 BOD agenda; Jeff seconded. Unanimously approved.

Joel moved to approve the 3/13/24 BOD minutes; Jeff seconded. Unanimously approved.

Member comments: None.

President's Comments/Discussions:

Reminder about three-day Earth Day events. Directors should volunteer and be out there if possible. George is trying to get boat owners and Boat Club members to create a "Marina Team" to do regular marina maintenance work. According to the Town, the channel markers have been relocated, and there are ongoing discussions with the Town about taking over channel marker and dredge responsibilities. The Town approved a ban on balloons, as have other OBX towns.

Racquet Club Report: Penny

Update from Jay:

We will have a Racquet Club Board meeting April 18, with the following items (so far):

1. We circulated the Guidelines among the RC membership and received comments from one individual. We need to decide if we want to incorporate changes into the document, then have the vote by membership May 4. Question for SSCA Board - if we incorporate any <u>substantial</u> change, do we need SSCA approval again? Knowing this will help us to decide what to incorporate.

2. For landscaping, RC Board will discuss landscaping priorities, however we have no budget to spend. According to Tisa and Joel, we have two items - fix irrigation (done) and planting Wax Myrtles on the east side of the courts. We are open to volunteers, for instance Susan Ippolito knows Boys Scout volunteers who want to build benches for us.

3. We have ongoing issues with locks at both Hillcrest and Sea Oats and will discuss this at the RC Board meeting. Options are to switch Hillcrest back to the old Coba locks and replace the failing lock at Sea Oats with a Coba. Or not have a lock on Sea Oats at all. We would appreciate any guidance SSCA Board can provide.

4. We will discuss when we will have the contractor back to fix the dip and paint at Sea Oats, and do the resurface at Hillcrest.

Discussion concerning the locks—that they actually work fine. Members just need to hit "clear" before entering the code. Put up a small sign explaining how to use. Discussion re final punchlist issue on pickleball courts and having the contractor finalize. SSCA still holding a retainer on that work.

Discussion re using storm reserves for \$1,800 repairs to Sunset Viewing Platform property rather than operating expenses. Bylaws permit as long as there is a designated reserve account. Suggestion from Susan re establishing a policy for using reserve funds like this, a maximum amount (\$2,500?) without specific Board approval. Will address in budget discussions later this year as well as consider adding a line item for unexpected/contingency expenses.

Bylaws/Long-Range Planning/ARB: Don

Please let me know if you see things in the Bylaws that need to be clarified or adjusted. Don said Rick Koch is chair of the ARB, which now has its full five members. He also pointed out how many separate

covenants there are for Southern Shores properties and that some cover only one or two lots or possibly only a single street or block.

Westside Parks & Marinas: George

West Side Parks and Marinas

- Boardwalk at Loblolly Marina completed with water & power utilities installed.
- Reroofing right shed at east side of North Marina is underway. Water damage to front and back corners of left roof. Hardy Peters has no interest in left shed so it will be disposed of.
- Received notice to have Port-A-Potty at Triangle needs cleaning. Called Atlantic Sewage.
- His & Her Electrical performed electrical maintenance work at marinas (Replaced LED bulbs & photocells, Replaced GFCI outlets, circuit breakers & cover, tested all power stanchions). Invoiced was \$1050.
- Joel & I cleared out brush for Kayak racks at Loblolly. Albemarle Tree Service helped for free and was much appreciated.
- Ordered material for two kayak racks from list provided by Bob Baculik. Construction of kayak racks by Bob is underway.
- Haven't heard back from LSI Marina about 5 year plan for South Marina bulkhead repairs. They have not returned by call from last week. Will start looking for other marina construction companies.
- Joel & I determined kayak rack at Red Bay Lane is not on SSCA property.

Properties: Joel

+ The contractor finished the 172' long Loblolly Marina deck construction project, which also included extending water and electrical lines to two new power pedestals on this deck.

+ Helped Bob Baculik lay out two new kayak racks that he's going to build.

+ Finalized three XOVR replacement designs (west ramp for 132A Ocean Blvd; Mockingbird and 10th Avenue) and gave them to our contractor for cost proposals. Also, provided the contractor a design to replace the west stairs and ramp for the Hickory Trail XOVR with three sets of low rise stairs and two landings for cost development.

+ The contractor reroofed the storage building being saved on the east side of North Marina.

Discussion re prioritizing crossover repairs in light of budgeting issues. Joel suggested that storm reserves could be used for Mockingbird, where the blowing sand is burying the crossover. The Board determined to wait until the Fall to see how Mockingbird was used during the season and to see what funds might be available in the budget—otherwise budget for next year. 10th Ave. is a priority.

Old Business:

Jeff Updated that Karen Kranda and Ernie Dash had volunteered for the 2024 Nominating Committee, and Karen suggested giving Debbie Swick a call. No volunteers yet on the website email address.

AT cell tower proposal to extend term by 40 years. All agreed to table for now.

Lifeguard shed at Triangle: Joel gave update and recommendation that Trout Run is better than Hillcrest or Triangle. At Hillcrest you create problems with parking and that location is not centrally located. At Triangle, similar parking issues as well as possible conflict with cell tower operations. Trout Run is the best location, but we may need to require some screening for the neighbors.
