• It has been my honor to serve as a member of the SSCA board and want to thank all members of the board, our membership, clubs, and volunteers for all their hard work and commitment to making our community a wonderful place to live. I hope to see you around town.

Slip Rentals

- O We have added six wet slips at Loblolly Marina, three wet slips at the Northwest Marina, and a special thank you to Mr. Michael Eaton and his Egale Scout Candidate Project, there seven new dry slips at the Northeast Marina. Additionally, he and his Boy Scout team have added wind anchors at each dry slip location and all existing posts replaced.
- The current numbers on the waiting list:
 - Kayak Racks 15
 - Wet Slips 40
 - Dry Slips − 14.
- o In 2024 we are looking into adding more kayak racks to clear as much of the kayak rack waitlist.

Channel

We are waiting for the approval of the Major CAMA Permit to move four channel makers providing better navigable water. Once approved the SSCA will contract the work.

• Eurasian Milfoil

O We are continuing to work closely with the Town of Southern Shores, Martins Point HOA, USCG auxiliary, and NC Aquatic Weed Control Division and hope to start reducing the amount of milfoil in the canals, around the marinas, and parts of JG in mid spring.

- Thank you to Len and Lisa for leading the volunteers for the grass planting (50,000 sprigs and near a mile of sand fence). Lion share of the work was paid for by the interest on the county beach nourishment fund.
- No council meeting tomorrow night due to the weather forecast.
- Town of Duck is planning on extending multi use path on the westside of Duck. One of the scenarios shows it in the town of Southern Shores. The town is not planning to extend the sidewalk at that location. TOSS is planning on a sidewalk from East Dogwood to Hickory.
- Ripple fiber Law in NC gives a public utility the right to the town's right of way.
- Kimberly Horn's presentation about the placement of the Juniper culvert will be moved March 6th.

- I also want to thank those who will be leaving the board for their service over the last couple of years:
 - Ernie Dash Ernie served two consecutive terms on the SSCA board (as well as serving on the arb!) he has been instrumental in improving our procedures in our accounting area, and worked closely with our

- amazing bookkeeper Kim Prince to ensure that our budgets are put together on time, and are realistic; that our monthly board treasurer reports are up to date and accurate; and our audits and taxes are done on time! We will miss him and his M&Ms he brought to our monthly board meetings that gave us energy through our long meetings!
- O Mike Guarracino this was Mike's first term with the SSCA, and he brought a fresh perspective to how we manage our slip rentals, introducing new procedures and ways to streamline the process! I know he had an opportunity to meet a lot of people in our community as he worked through our slip wait lists! He also worked with getting new slips built at the loblolly and north marinas, which are very much needed. mike has been a great liaison for the SSCA with the town and with Martin's Point on various mutually beneficial efforts.
- o Rick Koch— Rick took over this position probably not realizing how much he was taking on we certainly didn't know we were going to be building pickleball courts! and he took that on as our project manager, working with an ad hoc pickleball committee. It's great that the project is completed now! and we came in pretty much right on budget! great job, Rick! we will miss you but we know you'll be busy in your new role as the boat club commodore!!
- O Lisa Minerich last, but not least!! Lisa has been an amazing volunteer coordinator! She has taken the position to a whole new level, introducing many new community wide events that have brought our community together. As our bylaws state, the general purpose of the SSCA is to promote unity of purpose and harmonious relations among the members of the SSCA and between the members and the other residents of Southern Shores. I think our Earth Day, Music in the Parks, Ice Cream Socials and the Santa Ride go a long way towards achieving this purpose. That's not to mention all the coordinating that she assists with when we are working to keep our community clean and maintained! Thank you Lisa for all you have done! we will miss you! but I have a feeling you will continue to be a volunteer for the SSCA in the future!
